2. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Define expectations for high-quality formative and summative assessment practices
- Support the use of assessment to improve student learning, progress, and outcomes
- Provide guidance to staff, students, and parents on how assessment supports learning
- Ensure that assessment practices are fair, inclusive, transparent, and rigorous

This policy ensures that assessment at 7Hills is not isolated practice but a strategic driver of teaching, learning, and school improvement.

3. Scope

This policy applies to:

- All students in Years 7–13
- All teaching staff across IMYC, IGCSE, and A Level programmes
- All subjects and departments
- All forms of assessment, including formative, summative, internal, and external

4. Aims of Assessment

Assessment at 7Hills aims to:

- Support and improve student learning and progress
- Provide clear, actionable feedback
- Inform teaching, planning, and intervention
- Enable students to understand next steps
- Provide reliable data for reporting and decision-making
- Promote student ownership of learning

5. Principles of Assessment

Assessment at 7Hills is:

- Formative (Assessment for Learning) – ongoing and responsive
- Summative (Assessment of Learning) – evaluative and standardised
- Assessment as Learning – reflective and student-driven

It is also:

- Valid, reliable, and fair
- Transparent and aligned to learning objectives
- Inclusive and differentiated

6. Types of Assessment

6.1 Formative Assessment

- Ongoing, low stakes
- Informs teaching and learning in real time

Examples:

- Questioning, mini quizzes, exit tickets
- Peer/self-assessment
- Draft work and feedback

- Retrieval practice

6.2 Summative Assessment

- Evaluates learning at defined points
- Used for reporting and benchmarking

Examples:

- End-of-unit tests
- End of Term exams
- Mock exams
- Coursework
- External examinations

6.3 Assessment as Learning

- Self-assessment and reflection
- Goal setting and metacognition

7. Assessment Across School Phases

7.1 IMYC (Years 7-9)

- Focus: Skills, concepts, inquiry
- Emphasis on formative assessment
- Use of rubrics and reflection
- Interdisciplinary and project-based summative tasks

7.2 IGCSE (Years 10-11)

- Focus: Knowledge, application, exam readiness
- Balanced formative and summative assessment
- Use of past papers and mark schemes
- Mock exams and coursework

7.3 A Levels (Years 12-13)

- Focus: Depth, independence, critical thinking
- Strong alignment with exam standards
- Essay writing, problem-solving, extended responses
- Mock exams and external assessments
